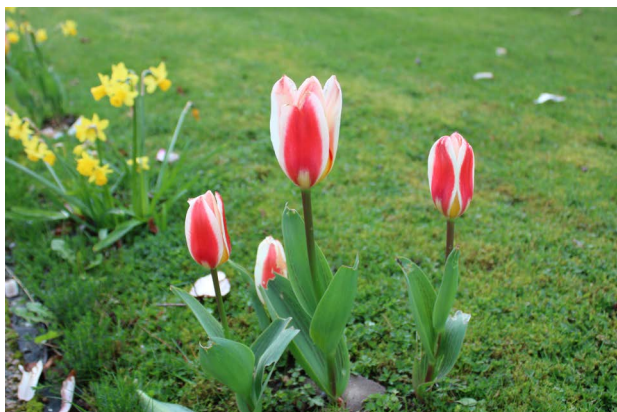


01 LauraLynn

We are supporting and caring for children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs through the provision of routine respite breaks and crisis care in our purpose-built respite house, Hazel House. We also support 6 adults with severe/profound intellectual disabilities to live their best possible lives in Willow View.

As a proud nurse and the Director of Nursing and Family Support Services in LauraLynn Children's Hospice & Disability Services for many years, I can assure you that a move to LauraLynn will be something you won't regret. Working in Hazel House is such an enriching experience, you get to be part of a team of Nurses, Healthcare Assistants, Administrators, and Allied Health Professionals, all working with the one common goal to support children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities have fun breaks whilst their families get an opportunity to rest or do activities with other children.

Working in Willow View you get an opportunity to be part of an innovative team supporting a group of wonderful people to live their best possible lives, you will be part of a team of Nurses, Healthcare Assistants, Administrators, Recreation leads, Allied Health Professionals and Transforming Lives Project Lead. In 2023 we embarked on an exciting project to support the adults in transitioning to an alternative specialist service provider that can better meet their rights, needs and

preferences. This arose from an extensive review of the Willow View service and a realisation that while the residents are much loved and well cared for physically and medically, gaps and limitations in the model of care were evident. Whilst the Transforming Lives Project is ongoing, we continue to support the adults living in the service through high quality care and supports.

So, if you seek a change, to work with a team of committed professionals in an innovative manner to really make a difference for children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs and adults with severe/profound intellectual disabilities, our Disability Services is the place for you.

Our LauraLynn Team look out for each other, we recognise the emotional impact of the work that we do, we offer a Clinical Supervision Programme, Clinical Debriefing, an Employee Assistance Programme, and a wide range of well-being opportunities. 05 The Journey So Far

The history of our disability service has evolved over many years from its beginnings in 1923 as a convalescence home, known as The Children's Sunshine Home, where children from the inner city attended. Today our disability service is, Hazel House a respite service for children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs and Willow View a residential service for adults with severe/profound intellectual disabilities. The Disability Services have been operating for more than 40 years.

These unique services offer an individualised model of care to children, adolescents and adults with severe to profound/intellectual disabilities and associated care and support needs.

Willow View and Hazel House are registered with HIQA as a Designated Centre for Persons (Children and Adults) with disabilities and are funded by the HSE under a Section 38 Provider Service Level Arrangement.

Willow View and Hazel House operate from the same campus as LauraLynn, Ireland's only Children's Hospice, in Leopardstown, Dublin 18.

06 Hazel House

Hazel House is a purpose built children's disability respite service which provides respite support and crisis care to children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs, with a maximum occupancy of five children at any time.

Our mission for our children's disability respite service is:

- To provide a Community of Care that delivers evidence-based, personalised services to children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs
- To advance the development and delivery of services to children with severe/profound intellectual disabilities and complex care needs through advocacy, research and education
